

FAQs: Medicaid DSRIP information sharing opt-out process

1. Has my Medicaid changed?

No, there is NO change to your Medicaid

2. What is DSRIP?

DSRIP is a program that encourages greater collaboration between healthcare providers and community service providers to provide better care for patients. Patients do not “sign-up” or “register” for DSRIP. Their providers may choose to participate as a way to provide better care.

3. Can I still see my same doctors?

Yes, whether you opt out of information sharing or not, you will continue to have the same access to your providers.

4. Why should I agree to my information being shared?

DSRIP is designed to help your doctors and providers work together to provide you with the best care possible. With greater access to your health history, providers and provider networks have a clearer picture of your needs and how they can best help you to feel better and remain healthy.

5. What if I don't respond to the letter?

If you do not respond to the letter, then your health information will be shared with a network of providers in a safe, secure and legal manner, in order to aid providers in better coordinating care for you.

6. I do not want my information shared, what do I do?

If you want to “opt-out” of sharing your data, you must call the Medicaid call center at **1-855-329-8850** or complete and return the form that came with your letter.
